

In Art, we have been learning about how plants grown on the banks of the River Nile were used to make paper called Papyrus. We immersed ourselves in making our own 'Ancient Egyptian' style paper which we will then apply our designs to. We thoroughly enjoyed our Ancient Egyptians history workshop just before the half term break and launched into our new geography topic about the River Nile by looking at different types of maps which included the River Nile. We applied this to a team puzzle task which required us to identify features of the River Nile such as the delta, mouth and source and use this knowledge to piece together deconstructed maps. At Roebuck we are geographers!

Year 5 have had a busy start back to the half term.

In maths, we continued our topic on fractions, now looking at not just adding and subtracting, but also multiplying fractions. The pupils are geniuses!

We will also be visited every Tuesday by Herts cricket coach Matt who is going to teach us the key skills of cricket. After the first lesson we have noticed some natural talent already.

In Geography, we have also started our new topic on North America, where we used compass directions and an atlas to match up different countries to their position in relation to each other.

In mathematics, we have started using ratio and using it with measurements e.g. a recipe of 4 pizzas to 2 pizzas. In our English, we started a non-chronological report about Mount Everest. We had an Experience day where we wrote about a climber's equipment if they climbed Everest. On the 8th, we had to be in our P.E kit and do an activity: Spotty dogs; Mountain climbers; Push-ups and Star-jumps. Also, in our new computing unit we are learning about Text Adventures. We started off by following some choices to navigate through a story. We are soon going to be designing our own chosen story. We started a new Science unit this week which is about the circulatory system and we learnt about how the blood pumps around the body to our organs.

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
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Library opening
