

We learnt that at the end of Ramadan, when Muslims no longer have to fast, there is a special holiday, called Eid al-Fitr. It lasts for three days and Muslims celebrate the breaking of the fast. 






Ash and Elder

This week we have been occupied with our Mock SATs. Some of us sat in the hall and in other rooms so we could experience what the real thing would be like.








