

### How is earning the code of conduct rewarded?

Every class has a code of conduct reward chart.

Every Friday, they will earn a sticker against their name if they have earned their code of conduct.

They can earn up to 4 certificates for keeping their code of conduct.

Bronze certificate - 10 weeks

Silver certificate - 20 weeks

Gold certificate - 30 weeks

Rainbow certificate - for not losing any code of conduct for the whole year.



Parents are invited to celebrate their child's achievement. If your child has achieved their code of conduct, you will be notified via a slip to inform you when the celebration assembly is taking place.

### How is the code of conduct taken away?

Children do not gain their sticker for the week if they have broken the code of conduct.

If children break the code of conduct, they are delayed by a week to get their next certificate.

If a child has lost 3 minutes in one session after warnings, this is classed as breaking the code of conduct and the child will lose their code of conduct as well as losing minutes from their golden time.



### Golden time



Golden time is a reward for children behaving well during the week.

In Key Stage 1, children have daily golden time at the end of the day.

In Key Stage 2, children have their golden time on a Friday afternoon.

During this time, children are given the opportunity to sign up to a range of different activities such as sports, art and ICT.



### How is Golden Time lost?

Children lose minutes off their golden time for low level behaviour such as calling out in class and distracting others.

They can also lose it for failing to read, not handing in homework on time or not learning their spellings and Learn Its.

### What happens if my child is absent?

If your child is absent due to illness or holiday, they are unable to get their sticker for that week.

This means your child will not get their certificate until a week later.
