

English

Narrative:

We will begin by looking at a range of Greek Myths, exploring how they were written and what lessons can be learnt from them. The children will work towards writing their own Greek Myth, focusing on characterisation and how they can be effectively described.

Non-fiction:

Later in the term, we will explore discussion texts. We will consider different sides of an argument which will lead onto deciding a particular course of action.

Poetry:

We will research a poet and formulate personal responses to their poetry. We will also recite familiar poems by heart.

PSHE - Zones of Regulation:



We will continue our learning about Zones of Regulation by: Understanding different perspectives; recognising our own feelings and how these change; exploring tools to calm and alert.

Design and Technology

Pupils will explore pavilion structures, learning about what they are used for and investigating how to create strong and stable structures. They will then design and create their own pavilions, complete with cladding.

Decimals:

Understanding tenths, hundredths and thousandths

History - Groovy Greeks




The children will be exploring many different aspects of Greek culture this term, focusing on family life, the structure of society, Greek Culture, the Olympic Games, Greeks at war and the legacy they left behind.

RE

We will be learning about forgiveness and whether or not Christians believe in forgiveness. Our key learning question for this term is: Is forgiveness always possible for Christians?

Art

In this collection of lessons children learn and develop their skills in: design, drawing, craft, painting and art appreciation; creating an optical illusion print, replicating a plate in the famous willow pattern, carving sculptures out of soap, drawing a collection of still life objects, painting and mixing colours like Paul Cézanne and learning about the role of a 'curator'.



Computing - spreadsheets

Children will learn how to read and input data into a spreadsheet. They will learn how to format cells, input formulas and use timers. They will then analyse the data, creating a range of graphs.

Music

Music this term focuses around one song: Blackbird. We will focus on the different dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.), singing and playing instruments. We will also introduce freestyle using instruments within the song Blackbird.
