We will be creating non-fiction travel journals using sub-headings, 'Did you know?' questions and fantastic fun facts.

We will also be using the text 'Wombat goes Walkabout' to create our own fictional stories using adjectives, similes, alliteration and abstract nouns.

We will have a poetry week exploring various animal poems.

Mathematics

Our Inspire math scheme continues with topics including Numbers to 100, multiplication and division, money and time. We will be starting to use bigger numbers when using calculations and problem solving.
