






In Year 1 we are... SUPER!








This week we entered two teams into the sporting futures rowing event. Both teams worked incredibly hard and improved as the event went on.






The girls Netball team played their 2nd game of the season winning 17-0. The game was played in great spirits by both teams.



This half term the year 5 and 6's have taken part in the Stevenage Sporting Futures Archery competition.




Silver- In Year 6 mixed team and the Year 6 Boys Team.

It is really important that the pupils at Roebuck Academy have participated in The Big Ambition survey and had their say.

I want to ensure that the voices of the children in Hertfordshire are fairly represented in the findings so that I can share their views with the most senior members of the country.

I must reiterate that it is vital that all children have their voice heard through this survey because, as Children's Commissioner for England, I have a statutory duty to protect and promote the views and interests of children. The Big Ambition provides a much-needed opportunity for the children of England to tell political decision makers what is important to them ahead of the General Election. I will be sharing their responses with Government to ensure that children's voices are heard.

Children can complete the survey in assemblies, form times, PSHE or in other lessons this term. The survey can also be done as homework and parents can assist children who cannot complete the survey themselves (children under 5 and children with Special Educational Needs). This is a great opportunity to teach children about politics and why it is important for them to use their voice!
