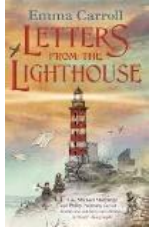


## English

Over this half term, the children will experience a range of genres, where they will be reading, analysing and then writing examples of different text types. One of the texts this half term will be 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. Grammar will continue to be a large part of our learning, revising a lot of the content taught during Key Stage 2.



## Computing

This term, the children will continue to design and plan their own games before adding some code to bring it to life and play their creation. We will then move on to Online safety and blogging.



## Maths

The children will start the term developing their understanding of fractions. Pupils will be working with basic fractions and mixed numbers. They will then begin to add and subtract fractions with different denominators, including mixed numbers. Bar model diagrams are incorporated to support pupils' understanding before moving on to multiplication and division. Pupils will also be required to divide fractions by whole numbers and will explore different methods. The unit to follow will be decimals. To begin with, pupils will read and write decimals before moving on to dividing and multiplying decimals. Pupils will then be asked to write fractions as decimals using division and pictorial methods before looking at multiplying fractions that involve some regrouping and renaming by 1-digit numbers.

## Science

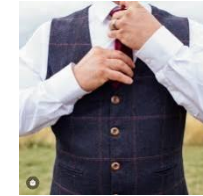
### Evolution and inheritance

In this topic, the children will be taught how living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. We will look at how living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents. Finally, the children will look at how animals and plants have adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.



## DT

Our focus for this half term will be on designing our own waistcoats using old items of clothing as part of our World War themed 'Make Do and Mend' unit. We will be asking children to bring in an old adult shirt that they can use to cut out a waistcoat shape. The children will be learning about how to use a template, pinning an item and stitching it together along with some added flourishes if time allows.

## History - What was the impact of World War 2 on the people of Britain?

This half term we continue to ask 'Why does religion look different around the world?' We will be building on comparisons about the origins of the Abrahamic religions, children consider how culture, tradition, migration and interpretation can affect how some religious practices are observed.
