




YELLOW CHALLENGE: Have a go at making your own 'nature art'.



Through their sensitivity, curiosity, ingenuity, bravery and innocent niceness, they make a massive impact on Ahmet's life, friends, class, school, community and wider world. There's a lovely lack of stereotyping on gender and back story for the narrator, which adds to the message of not judging people before you know them.


